POLICY OBJECTIVE

This policy supports a structured and systematic development of the sport of figure skating in Western Australia.

POLICY

To ensure fair qualification for entry to the Western Australian Championships (Basic Novice, Intermediate Novice, Intermediate, Advanced Novice, Junior and Senior Singles, Basic Novice, Intermediate Novice, Advanced Novice, Junior and Senior Ice Dance, Senior, Junior, Advanced Novice, Basic Novice, Mixed Age, Adult and Advanced Adult Synchronized Teams or Basic Novice, Advanced Novice, Junior and Senior Pairs, Adult Silver, Gold, Masters, Elite Singles or Dance, Adult Elite Masters Pair, Adult Masters Pair or Adult Pair..

General

- 1 Singles/Pairs and Dance Athletes must have competed in both the short program and free skate programs (where applicable) in the 2019 Mary-Ellen Holland Competition or hold an approve bye from the Mary-Ellen Holland Competition.
- 2 Synchronized Teams must have competed in both the short program and free skate programs (where applicable) in an Interstate Synchronized Competition or Championships eg the ISWA Championships or the Sydney Synchronized Festival in the competitive season preceding the close of entries for the Western Australian Championships.

For both the qualifying competitions/championships and the WA State Championships all athletes/teams must be eligible under the relevant Ice Skating Australia or WAISA by-laws and athletes must be a current financial WAISA member for 2019 or must have made application for WAISA membership no later than June 8th 2019. For Synchronized Teams the team that competes at the 2019 WA State Championships must comprise of no less than 75% of the team that competes at the qualifying competition/championships and the total number of team members must remain the same as at the qualifying competition.
- 3 Refer WAISA Policy Document 002, Granting a Bye from Western Australian Competitions and Western Australian Championships.

Titles

- 4 The title "Western Australian State Champion" shall be awarded only to a Member of WAISA who is an Australian citizen or has been a resident of Australia for a period of not less than 12 months at the time of the commencement of the applicable Western Australian Championship event or Competition.
- 5 Subject to 3 above, the title "Western Australian Champion" shall be awarded to the winner of the Senior division at the Western Australian Championship, in as many divisions of figure skating, pair skating, ice dancing and synchronized skating as the WAISA Council shall determine.
- 6 Other division winners are awarded the title of "WA Champion" for that division.

Awards

- 7 Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be presented to the Champion and the second and third placed competitors respectively. Invited participants from other ISA or ISU members, who place in any of the three positions in a Western Australian Championship event, will be given appropriate medals in addition to the three highest places Western Australian competitors.

Eligibility (Addendum to Eligibility Rule: Section 28 of the Constitution)

- 8 Participation in a Western Australian Championship event or Competition is open to persons belonging to WAISA, who are eligible in accordance with the ISU Eligibility Rules.
- 9 The WAISA Council may, in its discretion, allow persons belonging to another ISA or ISU member to participate in a Western Australian Championship event or Competition as an "Invited Participant".
- 10 Invited participants from other ISA or ISU members competing in a Western Australian Championship event or Competition, must meet ISA specified test requirements, or their own equivalent, and may not compete in a lower division than that in which they have competed in their home state or country.

REASONING

This policy is aimed to support the development of the sport and the successful growth of our sport.

- 11 Medals will be awarded to the three highest-placed Western Australian competitors.
